Seek His guidance and know you have a praying family that cares. May GOD BLESS YOU.



Romans 1:16 says, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek." ESV. As the New Testament Riders section of CMA, we were very active this past month in different activities, bike blessings, prayer, bible studies, etc. In the CMA handbook there is a suggestion to have a testimony ready to give to anyone who is asking questions about faith. Have you practiced your testimony lately? If you have not, it is a good idea as this spring we will be involved in areas where we may have a chance to share the gospel with someone.

1 Peter 3:15 tells us how to do this, "In your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and respect." ESV. We should always try to live our lives everyday as honoring Christ the Lord as holy. There is much that goes into the explanation, but simply we should put Christ first in our life and live everyday for Him to the best of our ability being filled with the Holy Spirit. We cannot do that alone, we have to have the in working of the Holy Spirit in our lives. As we go about our lives and routines, as we are confronted with people, we will be ready to share the gospel and give our testimony. Our CMA handbook suggests working out a testimony of how Jesus Christ saved you, but no more than 2 minutes long. If you are honoring Christ as Lord everyday of your life and you have a testimony to tell, the Holy Spirit will lead you into a conversation of sharing the gospel with someone. Note that there is a way in which we do this with "gentleness and respect." No one wants to be talked down to, when we share the gospel, we should show respect to the person we are addressing the same way we would want someone to converse with

Remember, we can't "save" anyone. Only Jesus Christ can do that. We share the gospel with others, the Holy Spirit brings conviction, and then it is up to the person to respond to Jesus Christ. We are not responsible for their salvation, but we are responsible to share the gospel with them so they can know how to get saved and enter the kingdom of God.

MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST



Reminder Before Riding

Always check the following

- 1. Tire pressure
- 2. Oil levels when engine is hot
- 3. Lights
- 4. Battery terminals
- 5. Nut & bolts are tight
- 6. Brake pads
- 7. Air filter
- 8. Tire wear
- 9. Inspection sticker
- 10. Any leaks
- 11. Chain or belt tension
- 12. Wheel spokes loose or tight

Common Car vs Bike Crashes





Bic dist is irrelevant or hidden by sight eard work or inctions on the edge of the road.



Bicyclist is irrelevant or screened by passing motorists, or driver underestimates bicyclist's speed.



Bicyclist is irrelevant, or motorist underestimates bicyclist's speed and distance needed to pass.




Motorist underestimates space needed to pass safely and squeezes by within the lane.

All of these crashes are the motorist's fault. But a bicyclist with the freedom to drive defensively can avoid them.



DEFENSIVE DRIVING: Ride farther left to maintain vantage and visibility around sight obstructions.



DEFENSIVE DRIVING: Ride farther left to increase vantage and visibility to opposing left turn lane.



DEFENSIVE DRIVING: Ride farther left to discourage motorists from passing before turning right.



DEFENSIVE DRIVING: Ride farther left to discourage motorists from trying to squeeze past.

GOD HELP!

If you're like me, you have experienced some difficult times. During these times, I often coach myself, saying, "You got this," "This too will pass and work out in the end." I square my shoulders up and power through, letting a laugh out along the way. Some things can hit you when this tactic doesn't work. This is an excellent question to ask yourself: Where is God in all this? Do I really have it? Things can get tough out there; mix in your emotions and others; it's just downright difficult. If the emotions aren't enough, throw in a dose of confusion and uncertainty, you have a recipe for disaster. Be sure that once things get to this point, the enemy is whispering lies that stand against the will of God. These well-meaning people will repeat those lies as the truth, and then the enemy will have time with your mind as you sort through life. Know this, where there is confusion, the enemy is in the middle of it. Suddenly, "You don't have this," and your laugh is gone. You are caught up in a full-blown war of the spirit. At this time, you need your Father, and those around you need someone to lead the way because the way is hidden from sight. The fog of lies and emotions has taken over, and there seems to be no way out. Amid desperation, you cry out, "God, help me!"

This can and does happen in our personal life and chapter life. The father of confusion wants to destroy the work of God by getting us to focus inwardly. In times like these, we need a message from God, whether from a message spoken through your pastor or in reading your Bible. Here, you must be careful because our motive can really keep us from God's desire. If we want to punish people or prove how right we are, we can misuse His Word, but a pastor can speak a hard truth to us. He may look you in the eye and say, "You don't got this; you never did." Then, preach a message aimed right at your problems and never know he did it. You realize that God has spoken to you through a pastor at that moment. You best be in a Bible-believing and preaching church to help safeguard you and keep you pointed on the right path.

Let's look at a scripture that has helped me tremendously. Psalm 31:19-20 (NLT), "How great is the goodness you have stored up for those who fear you. You lavish it on those who come to you for protection, blessing them before the watching world. You hide them in the shelter of your presence, safe from those who conspire against them. You shelter them in your presence, far from accusing tongues."

I get excited just reading over these. God has goodness stored up for you, and He will pour it out on you when you come for help and protection. How awesome! When we cry out, "God, help me," we go to Him for protection. He is ready to pour out goodness on you, and in the meantime, He will hide you in His presence, far from accusations. Wow, that is good news. Here's the catch: we must trust in His kindness, go to Him for protection, and then spend time in His presence to be hidden. His protection doesn't take me out of the war but protects me through it. Praise God for His promises. This is a comfort to the soul;

it doesn't matter how the future unfolds. What matters is that I belong to God, who will protect and lavish goodness on me. So, with strong faith, I say, "God, help me. I don't have this, but You do."

Where are you in life today? Are you in the midst of battle, walking around saying I got this? Today is the day to say the battle belongs to the Lord.

Is the chapter you're in causing you trouble? Are you unsure how to move forward? It's time to run to God for protection.

Let me pray this over you today. Father God, I ask that the wind of Your spirit blow out the fog so that

they may see clearly. Lavish them with Your goodness as they come to You. Amen.
