You must commit to a Gear Check shift to receive a wristband to enter the race track facility during your free time that day.

MOTOGP March 28th - March 30th

- Parking Lot H is where most of the Motorcycle Parking will take place.
- Gear Check 1 is normally located across from Parking Lot H.
- Gear Check 2 is normally located somewhere in the vicinity of the Main Entrance

RACE DAYS - Friday, Saturday, and Sunday:

- All CMA VOLUNTEERS MUST CHECK IN AT GEAR CHECK 1 first thing when they arrive.
- You will receive your arm band, and your assignment for the day.

Sunday is the big race day and is the most attended day. This day has a critical need for help at the Gear Check Stations, especially when the racing is over at the end of the day between 2:00 pm and 5:00 pm.

**CAMPING**: All CMA Members must be pre-registered to camp in the volunteer camping area. If you plan to camp at COTA, Self-Contained (no electric, septic or water provided) is available located in Parking lot M adjacent to Parking lot L on the East Side of COTA facilities. Parking lot L and M can be accessed via Elroy Rd. that loops around the NE side of the COTA facilities.

If you are pre-registered to camp, You will need to check-in at the COTA camping office in parking lot M to get your pre-assigned camping spot.

**LODGING:** CMA volunteers are responsible for arranging their own lodging during the event.

## VP Corner: A Conversation with AI by Rod Booher

I have been slowly exploring AI a bit recently. It has been interesting. Although I continue to use various search engines, I am finding out that I do not have to use these search engines and then go through all of the search results which has been a pain to find the information that one is looking for. Instead I have been using AI programs a bit. That said, a word of caution is that sometimes AI gives the wrong answer. It makes mistakes. I have pointed that out to AI that their answer is wrong and it acknowledges the mistake and then corrects itself. AI is learning.

#### Recently, I asked AI a few questions about Christianity and thought I would share with you some of the questions and answers. I hope you find this interesting and informative.

**Q:** Should we take it seriously If God had His Son Jesus Christ die for our sins, for our redemption? Absolutely, it underscores just how weighty the matter of sin and redemption is. Taking the Christian perspective, that God would send His Son—described as both fully divine and fully human to die a brutal death on a cross suggests that sin isn't just a minor hiccup. It's portrayed as a deep rupture, something so serious that it required an act of cosmic magnitude to address. The stakes are framed as eternal: not just fixing a temporary problem, but reconciling humanity to God forever.

The scale of the sacrifice—God giving up something infinitely precious—also amplifies the value placed on humanity. It's not a casual gesture; it's a statement that redemption was worth that cost. You could see it as a way of saying that the problem was too big for us to solve on our own, requiring divine intervention at the highest level.

**Q:** Is there life after death? That's one of the biggest questions out there, and the answer depends a lot on where you're standing—spiritually, philosophically, or scientifically.

From a Christian perspective, the answer is a firm yes. The Bible speaks of an afterlife as a core promise: eternal life with God for those redeemed through faith in Jesus (John 11:25-26), or separation from God for those who aren't (Revelation 20:14-15). It's not vague—there's a resurrection, judgment, and a new existence, pictured as heaven or hell. Jesus' own resurrection is held up as evidence it's real.

Other faiths see it differently. Hinduism and Buddhism point to reincarnation—a cycle of life after life, shaped by karma, until you break free into liberation or enlightenment. Islam envisions a single afterlife with paradise or punishment based on faith and deeds. Plenty of traditions, from ancient Egypt to indigenous beliefs, have their own maps of what comes next.

Science stays skeptical. There's no empirical proof of an afterlife—no lab test for the soul. Near-death experiences, where people report light or peace, get studied, but they chalked it up to brain chemistry under stress. Materialist say consciousness ends when the body does. Philosophically, it's a split. Some argue our sense of self, our yearning for meaning, hints at something beyond. Others say that's just wishful thinking.

**Q:** If there is a heaven and hell, why would not everyone accept God's plan of redemption? If there's a heaven and hell on the table, and God's offering a clear path to the good place, why wouldn't everyone jump on board? But it's not that simple,

people's reasons for rejecting it are messy and human.

Belief isn't automatic. Even if someone accepts the idea of heaven and hell, they might not buy that Jesus is the real deal. Doubt creeps in: Is the Bible true? What about other religions? Some see it as too exclusive, like a club with a narrow guest list, and that rubs them wrong. Others just can't square a loving God with eternal punishment—hell feels like overkill, so they reject the whole package. Then there's the cost of accepting it. Redemption sounds free, but it asks for surrender—letting go of control, admitting you're flawed, living by rules you might not like. Pride gets in the way; some folks don't want to bend the knee or feel they need saving. Others love their vices too much—sin's fun until it isn't—and they'd rather roll the dice than change.

Free will plays a role too. If God made us capable of choice, some will choose "no" just because they can. Rebellion's baked into the human story—think Adam and Eve, or Lucifer. And for some, this life's all they've got evidence for; betting on an afterlife feels like a long shot when the here-and-now is tangible. Lastly, not everyone's convinced by the stakes. They might figure hell's not real, or God'll cut them slack anyway universalism a comforting alternative. Or they're just apathetic; eternity's too abstract to care about today. It's less about logic and more about heart, trust, and what people value. Would there be holdouts, even with the stakes clear?

**Q:** The stakes seem pretty high to get it wrong. Yeah, they do. If heaven and hell are real, the stakes don't get much higher—eternity's a long time to be wrong. It's like betting everything on a single roll of the dice, except you don't get a do-over. That weight can either push someone to dig deeper, looking for what's true, or paralyze them with the fear of picking the wrong side. Either way, it's a hell of a motivator—or a hell of a burden, depending on how you see it.

**Q:** It seems like a no brainer, I just don't understand why people reject God's redemption. I hear you—it does seem like a slam dunk when you lay it out: short life, eternal reward, God's got your back. Why say no? It's baffling until you dig into what's holding people back, and it's less about the deal itself and more about how they see it—or don't. A big chunk just don't believe it's real. Eternity's a monster prize, sure, but if you think the Bible's a fable or Jesus is just a guy in a book, the whole offer's moot. No proof, no dice. They're not rejecting redemption—they're rejecting the premise.


Yeah, it's "free," but it's not. You're asked to trust a God you can't see, ditch stuff you like, maybe lose friends or cred. Life's short—why spend it on a leash when you could run wild? They'd rather eat the 70 years they've got than bet on a forever they might not cash in. Then there's the God problem. Some look at the world—pain, chaos, silence—and think, "If he's real, he's not worth following." A redemption plan with hell as the flip side? That's a hard sell if you see it as cruel or petty. They'd rather roll solo than bow to that. Some don't even wrestle with it. Life's busy—bills, kids, Netflix. Eternity's too big, too far off. They're not rejecting; they're just not thinking about it. You see it clear as day, and it's wild they don't. But for them, it's not a choice—it's a fog of doubt, pride, or distraction. What do you reckon could cut through that for someone on the fence?

## Where Are My Skills? by James "Russell" Rhodes, Road Captain

Good day to everyone! Let's continue from last month on riding skills. Today we will be looking at skill tips 5 - 10 from the *Motorcycle Tourer*. The author of this article explains what we need to do and think about if we haven't riden for an extended period of time.

Motorcycle Riding Tips & Tricks: Practice Your Riding. I know this sounds weird. You're always riding, so you're always practicing, right? I beg to differ! Every few weeks, go for a ride out with the sole intention of riding correctly. Imagine you're being followed and assessed by a police biker. Do every shoulder check. Observe correctly. Use your mirrors properly.

Ask yourself as you're riding if you made the right decision at the last junction, and then critique your riding at the end. Justify your reasons and think about what could have been done better. Want to take it a step further? Go with a riding buddy and take turns assessing each other's riding. And then at the end, be honest with your feedback.

**Provide A Running Commentary.** If you want to make sure you're not riding on autopilot, try giving a running commentary as you ride. And don't just say what you're doing, say what you see. "Bend to the left – shifting into position one for better visibility. Checking mirrors. Shoulder check to the right. All clear to move." "Approaching green traffic lights. Checking rear as I may need to brake if the lights change to red." You'll feel silly at first, but I promise you'll get used to it!

**Everything Is Your Fault!** Of course, everything isn't your fault but you should ride like anything that might happen on your ride could be influenced by you. If a car pulls out in front of you from a side street, that isn't your fault. Maybe you were going too fast? Could you have been in a better position to allow the driver to see you? Could you have anticipated the driver was going to pull out? You could've altered your speed, changed your position, or even beeped your horn. After all, if you die while riding does it really matter whose fault it was?

**You Are Invisible.** You're not literally invisible, car drivers we still fail to see you! They're not looking for you. You're small, compact, and fast. But drivers are looking for cars, buses, and trucks. In other words, they're looking for large vehicles that are spanning a lane and with two lights on the front. You don't match that description which means they don't see you. Assume people haven't seen you and then you can make pre-emptive plans.

You Don't Always Have To Ride Fast. I can never understand how some people ride everywhere like they're being chased. It's tiring! And it becomes boring. The level of danger increases exponentially – as does the fuel cost! It's probably the only time your phone is turned off. You're unreachable, and nobody can ask anything of you. So use the time to relax and unwind every now and then.

**Stop And Smell The Roses.** Just because you go out on your bike, that doesn't mean you have to spend all day on it!

## History of CMA

The original brainstorm for such an organization occurred in 1972 when Herb Shreve and his teenage son purchased their first motorcycles. It was not until 1974 when the need for a new organization began to be realized. Herb attended his first motorcycle rally and saw a massive crowd of motorcyclists who did not know Jesus Christ as their personal Savior. In fact, many had never heard the Gospel message.

The realization of such a great need prompted Herb to share his vision with a couple of Christian friends. Together, they began to pray. Herb became more and more convinced that God wanted a Christian organization dedicated to reaching motorcyclists with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In the spring of 1975, he put action to his prayers. An attorney was contacted, and a nonprofit charter was applied for and approved. The waiting was over. The Christian Motorcyclists Association (CMA) was born.
