Roman Road (or Road Map to Salvation)

The Apostle Paul's writings to the believers in Rome are captured in Romans. Someone combined various scriptures from Romans to be used to discuss salvation with non-believers. If you have heard of this method and used it, I would like to hear your stories. As we are bikers, we can consider this like a road map or GPS. Let's take a road trip with a non-believer down the Roman Road.

As with any trip, we start at the beginning point. The Roman Road begins with **Romans 3:23** which states "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God". We can use this to tell the non-believer that we are no better than them as we are sinners just like them. **Romans 6:23** discusses the cost of sin, "for the wages of sin is death," but then finishes with "but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." This gives us and the non-believer hope.

During our trip, we make a lunch stop to see God's provision for salvation. This is found in **Romans 5:8** "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.". This shows just how much God loves us...he sent his only Son to take death from us.

Our next stop is for supper where we discover instructions for receiving salvation in **Romans 10:9-10** "If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord, "and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved." You will note that there are two parts to salvation, an internal belief and an external expression.

After a short ride, now is a good time to stop at an overlook to see God's creation. This overlook is **Romans 10:13** "for, "everyone who call on the name of the Lord will be saved." Hopefully, our non-believer has been digesting supper and now is a good time to ask the non-believer if they would like to ask Jesus Christ to come into their life. If so, you can lead them in the Prayer of Salvation "Lord Jesus, I am a sinner and need Your salvation. I believe You died for me and rose from the dead. I now call upon Your name and ask You to come into my life. I pray this in Jesus' name. Amen".

Our final stop is for Ice Cream. Here we enjoy the results of salvation which can be found in **Romans 5:1** "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.", **Romans 8:1** "Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus," and **Romans 8:38-39** "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

It is now time to head home, hopefully with a new brother or sister in Christ. If not, at least we have planted seeds (fed them) and God will nurture them.

Final thoughts

- As I have said before, to ensure a better understanding of verses taken out of context, it is a good idea to read at least one verse before and one verse after the verse that is cited.
- The references are from the New International Version (NIV).
- You will find references to some of the verses on the back of our Highway Disciples business card along with a Prayer of Salvation.

It's All About Jesus

I was raised in a very strict Catholic home. My father had remarried after my mother's death, and it was my stepmother who made sure that we all went to church on Sundays. When I think of a Catholic church, the first thing that pops into my mind is the very hard pews. The kind of pews that were donated to the Smith County Jury Room, which also made Jury Duty uncomfortable. Then there's the droning of the priest saying things that I didn't understand.

For kids, the pews were extremely hard. But don't you dare squirm, because Mom would reach over and pinch you. It wasn't the regular sort of pinch either. She had a "pinch and twist" technique, which was very painful. This went on from as young as I can remember until the year that my older sister learned to drive. Then my parents stopped going but she still made my sister and I go to church. My half-brothers, her sons, were also excused from going to Church.

I was 17 when I received my first Bible. I remember this, because it was given to me by the Tyler Independent School District. Everyone got a Bible when they graduated. That was in 1983. I struggled to try to read it on my own and didn't get very far. Can you imagine what would happen now if a graduating class was given a Bible?!? Imagine the outrage!!

I was working at a call center making phone calls to sell magazine subscriptions in 1984. Yes, I was one of those people who would call during the dinner hour trying to sell you a subscription of TV Guide. A guy that also worked there invited me to a Christian concert with his Church's youth group. A "youth group"? I didn't know that Churches had youth groups or what a youth group was. Now that I honestly think about it, I always wondered why I never saw the few kids that I went to school with who were Catholics in Church on Sundays. I still don't know where they were.

If you haven't figured out my age by now, I'm up in years. This guy's youth group was going to an auditorium to see The Cruse Family in Concert. I'd never heard of them before. I didn't really know this guy, but it was a chance to get out of the house, so why not! I got my mom's permission, and I went with him. (Mind you, I have graduated high school at this point, but still living at home, so of course, I had to get mom's permission.)

The music was nice, and I really enjoyed the concert. Then it came time for the Message. And oh, what a Message it was! It was The Gospel! A story I'd never heard before! For years, I'd done what I thought, were all the "right things." I went to Church, I took Communion, I did the "church aerobics" as Bill calls them now - the standing, the kneeling and the sitting and repeat. I said my prayers. The prayers that I'd had to memorize. All of that.

But The Message I heard that night was something that washed over me. The tears were streaming down my face as I listened to the words that were being spoken. They spoke of a Jesus that I'd never known before. I'd always known OF Jesus, but that night, it was as if a light bulb had come on! I didn't just know OF Him anymore, I KNEW Him!! It was like 'I know who He is now!!! I stood when I was invited to. I walked the aisle when it was time. I went backstage where there were counselors waiting to talk to people.

The Youth Minister of the Youth Group that took us in 1 of the vans was there and asked if he could talk with me. Since I didn't know anyone else and I'd met him earlier, we talked. My life in Christ began that night. We talked and I wanted to get baptized right away. I wanted him to do it at the church where my friend also went.

I remember floating home on a cloud and telling my father, who'd waited up for me, that I'd been saved. He looked at me kind of funny and asked, "what about the Catholic church?" I didn't know what to say because I didn't understand the question.

Several weeks later, I was baptized in the Baptist Church where my friend was from and where the Youth Minister worked. Unfortunately, my friend was not able to be there that night, and neither was the youth minister. I still got baptized. Afterwards, I didn't really know anyone there, so I ended up sitting in the back by myself.

As the years went by, I tried to be a good Christian. I went to that Baptist church on Sundays, scribbling notes in my school-given Bible, because I never thought to bring a notepad. Life got in the way, and I made mistakes. I married too young to someone I should have known not to. Unfortunately, he didn't realize that I expected him to stop dating once we got married. Somewhere in the middle of all that, I had a child.

I remember taking a trip to San Antonio to see my Aunt Josie. She was divorced before marrying my Uncle Raymond and I needed someone to talk to. I remember we both got our Bibles out and went looking for scriptures for me to lean on that had helped her in the same situation. She prayed over me, and God gave the courage to do what I needed to do. I ended the relationship which had become not only emotionally abusive, but physical, as well.

After moving, I found a church where my son and I thrived. I hadn't been to a church since before I'd gotten married. My son was surrounded by friends from school, I was surrounded by ladies who loved on me, and I thanked God for placing us there. My health had taken a toll from the past relationship and my church family loved on me in so many ways that I can't think about it without crying.

As usual, *satan has a way of kicking up the dust whenever things are going well. Another man was placed in my life that I really should NOT have gotten involved in. But I did. It was a mistake from the beginning, and I knew it. Life lesson learned: Always trust your gut. I now have the habit of asking a marrying couple (whichever person I'm closest to) if they really want to go through with this. If someone had asked me that during my second relationship, I would have bailed in a heartbeat!

I was working at a telecommunications company and trying to make the best of things. A friend that I worked with would always talk about the people that she was taking classes with. I remember one of her stories - someone's house had burned, and she was telling me what the small group she was in was doing. She'd mentioned that "Bill had given Brandon a TV." She'd mentioned "Bill" before numerous times. It was always "Bill this" or "Bill that."

I didn't know it at the time that I requested that we hire her as my replacement as I'd been promoted, that God had brought her to me for a very important reason. She knew my future husband. Of course, it was not apparent to me at the beginning, but she did. When she first mentioned that Bill and I should hang out, she told me, "Now, he's not the most handsomest man I've met, but he is the sweetest man I've ever met."

Since she never did arrange for us to meet, I stepped way out of my comfort zone and asked her where he worked and what building he was in. I showed up to his office one day, for which he was not prepared for. We talked a little bit after he got off the phone and he asked for my number. Still being cautious, I gave him my work number. We ended up meeting for dinner one night and I could tell that he was a good man because he reminded me of my father. For those who don't know, I ADORE my father!

God had answered my prayers to find me someone to be friends with, but I wondered if he would go to church with me. I had to ask and I prayed that God would give me the courage to do so. I told him after several dates, that if he wanted to continue to date me, that he would have to be a church-going man. I think he was taken aback at that, but he agreed. He'd been a Methodist, but he agreed to visit my church with me. I was hoping that someone would know him so that God could validate a thought that I had that maybe he was a truly good man! He walked in with me and I was pleasantly surprised when he was known by a family there who called him by an old nickname (which I don't have permission to repeat) that he was known by as a kid. They loved on him since they hadn't seen him in years while the matriarch of the family took me aside and told me that he was a really, really good person! I thanked God for that confirmation.

Through so many detours that I've had to take, and U-turns that I've had to do, I have to thank my Heavenly Father who allows the detours and U-turns and scenic routes that we seem to take whenever we take our focus off of Him. He provided me with a God-fearing man. My husband loves the Lord and serves the Lord every chance he can. He is such a great role model for my son, who didn't really have a great male role model growing up, except for his grandfathers. He is also a great role model for me, too, although he probably doesn't know it, until he reads this.

During life's struggles that still plague us, God shows up and out! He provided me with a help-mate just as He provided one for Adam. He loves us even when we struggle with the day-in and day-out things that happen. But, God. Oh! But God still loves us when we're hurting, or in the dark (literally and figuratively), or feeling alone. But God. That phrase fill me with such peace. I can be having the worst day (it seems like) and I will hear or think "But God." There is nothing that our God can't do. Hallelujah! Thank you, Jesus, for providing us with Your Love and Your Comfort when we need it.

I know that my God loves me! He answered my prayer when I asked Him if there were still good men left in the world by bringing one to me. I thank God every day for my blessings, especially the blessing of my husband. The safety and the security that I feel with my hubby is God's wink to me. I can almost hear my Heavenly Father saying to me, "I've got you, baby girl." That is such a great feeling to know that you're in the arms of Jesus, even when you don't even think you are.

It will drive you to your knees to ask for forgiveness and to praise His holy name. Then, and only then, do we recognize who He is and what our purpose in life is. You worship and enjoy Him forever. It is in that freeing moment that we understand what the intimacy of Christ is all about and why we want and need it so badly.

If your heart is not engaged during worship and your thoughts are not captive to the obedience of Christ, you might as well put a straw man in your seat. At least that is more honest than coming into God's house with no mind and no heart.

Many Christians do not worship with power, excitement, and zeal because they have no intimacy with Jesus at home. Those who have learned to worship and focus privately bring their own fire; a fire ignited in the secret closet of prayer. True worshipers can't wait to get to church to praise the Lord among his people.

It does not matter what you do to try to clean yourself up. If you don't trust Jesus to save you through his grace, all your righteousness is as filthy rags in God's sight. Despite all their failures, God came to them with a message of hope and love: "Since you were precious in my sight, you have been honored, and I have loved you" (*Isaiah 43:4*).

I will never forget the pain I endured when one of my teenage children confessed to me, "Dad, I've never once felt as if I have pleased you or felt worthy of your love. I feel like I've let you down my whole life. You must be really disappointed in me."

Those words hurt. I embraced that tearful child, hurting deeply inside myself. I cried with my reply, "But you have always been special to me. You have been the apple of my eye. Sure, you've done foolish, wrong things at times; but you are forgiven. You were truly sorry, and I never once thought less of you. You are nothing but a joy to me."

So it is with many Christians in their relationship with the heavenly Father. The devil has convinced them they have disappointed God and will never be able to please him. Consequently, they don't accept his love and live as if his wrath is always breathing down on them. What a horrible way to go through life. Oh, how pained God must be when he sees his children living this way.

As Christians, we can be assured that we are precious in God's sight. Trust in his love and grace, which can change our lives, no matter how unworthy or disappointed we may feel.

Question: I believe the most important thing we can do in life is develop our inner potential. I don't see why Christians tear people down by telling them they're sinful and worthless. You ought to encourage them instead to look within themselves and strive to reach their full potential.

Answer: I'm sorry if you've gotten the impression that Christians believe we are worthless—because the opposite is the case! Instead, we are so valuable in God's eyes that He sent His Son into the world to give His life for our salvation. Would He have done that if we were worthless?

At the same time, we will never become the people God wants us to be by looking only within ourselves. When we do that (as you are suggesting), we ignore God and think we can solve all our problems on our own. We become centered instead only on ourselves, and in our pride we put ourselves in the place of God. We end up denying our weaknesses and our selfish motives, and we have no real answer for our feelings of guilt or failure.

Most of all, looking only within ourselves means we overlook our greatest need: to be reconciled to God. God made you, and life's greatest joy comes from knowing Him and discovering His plan for our lives. It comes also as we discover the gifts and abilities He has given us, and begin using them for His glory. Nothing is greater than reaching God's potential for your life.

Don't turn your back on Christ. Face instead your need for His forgiveness and grace, and open your heart and life to His love and His transforming power. The Bible says, "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind" (Romans 12:2).

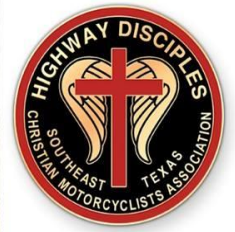
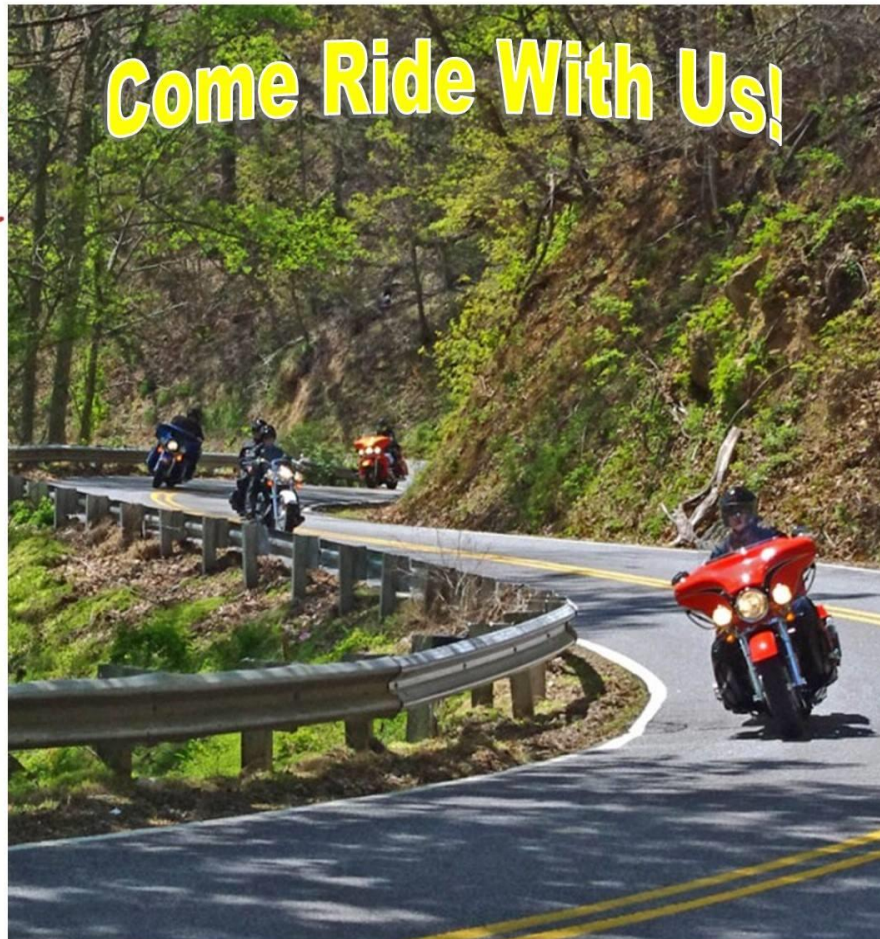
