Chaplain's Message

Hello, CMAers! Praise God for all He has done! I thought that I would tell you a little about myself in this first "official" article.

I was born in 1958 and from my earliest memories, I was at church every Sunday. I was saved in the fourth grade, and rededicated my life in the seventh. I went to C. E. King High School all four years and I was a member of the Christian group that was sponsored by one of the teachers at school, the King Christian Union. My Sophomore year, I was Student Council Rep for the KCU, Junior year I was Vice President and in my Senior year, I was President. After High School, I joined the Navy and was active for 10 years.

While I was in the Navy, I was stationed in Orlando for boot camp, then Great Lakes Naval training center for Electronics Tech school. After that, I was sent to Lowry Air Force Base for further training. When I left there, I took leave and came back home for a few weeks at which time I married my High School Sweetheart. We went to Naval Air Station Cecil Field for two years. I was then sent to Sardinia, Italy to the USS Orion, a submarine tender. My wife stayed in the States and so I was there by myself. From there, I as sent to Norfolk Naval Station to the USS Guadalcanal, a helicopter carrier and we were deployed for 8-10 months of the 15 months I was there. My wife was there some of the time and back home in Houston the rest. I was then sent to Great Lakes Naval Training Center to teach electronics. Throughout the years we were trying to have children, but were unable to. We finally decided to adopt a baby girl that had Down's Syndrome in 1984 and named her Dana-Joy Nicole. In 1985, a year and a half later, we had Kraig. He was born with liver issues. At that time, I decided to get out of the Navy because of his issues. Almost two years later, in 1987, Sam was born. In 1988, two things happened. My wife left and filed for divorce and Kraig had a liver transplant. Two weeks after his transplant, His body rejected the new liver and he passed on May 26, 1988, but God was with me.

Throughout this time we were in and out of church. After the divorce, I became active in various churches, helping with the youth and teaching Sunday School. Time went by, and in August 2000, I met Nancy. I was tag team teaching a Singles Sunday School Class, and Nancy walks in. I can remember seeing her and thinking about how her eyes lit up when she smiled. On Sunday, December 31, 2000, I asked her if she would like to go out to lunch after church. She agreed and we had a great time. I proposed in March of 2001 and we were married November 17, 2001. We had a blow to the family when we got a call in April 2002 that Dana-Joy had passed away, 2 days before her 18th birthday, but God was with us. We were blessed on July 19, 2004 when Matthew was born. It was a difficult time since he was diagnosed with Pierre Robin sequence and Sticklers. Pierre Robin was a condition that caused the soft palate in the back of the mouth to be cleft. Sticklers can cause issues with the connective tissues in the body. Because of the issues he had, he had to have a trach and a feeding tube put in. After several surgeries, the trach and feeding tube were able to be removed. He had numerous other surgeries during the early years of his life, but God was with us.

We continued living in the Houston area struggling to make ends meet. In May 2018, my mother passed away. My father felt the house was too big for him and offered it to me. We accepted and moved in during August 2019 after my father bought a small cabin and moved into it. We joined Waller Baptist Church during the pandemic where we met some guy from a Christian Motorcycle club named Mark White. We went to a meeting and fell in love with the organization and the people there and became active members. I also became involved in teaching Sunday School and Wednesday night Bible studies at Waller.

Sitting here writing this, I can look back over my life and see where God was guiding me, even when I didn't realize it at the time. He has been so good to me and my family. This is not saying that it's been easy or great all the time, but through the rough and difficult times, He has been there. I wrote this, partly because I've been wanting to write out my testimony, but also because I just wanted to let ya'll know where I've been at different times in my life. Yes, there were many other things that happened, some good, some not so good, but through it all God has been there.

I pray that God can use each and every one of us as He sees fit. We may not like what He wants us to do, or where He wants us to go, but remember that He is all knowing and He knows what's best for us, even if we don't think it will be that good!

New Year, New You: Why January is the Perfect Time to Start Weight Loss Journey

As the New Year unfolds, many of us find ourselves reflecting on the past and setting resolutions for the future. Among the most common goals is the desire to shed those extra pounds and embark on a journey to a healthier, happier self. January is the perfect time to kick start your weight loss journey.

I started in October of 2023 setting small goals. As of October 2024 I have lost 25 lbs according to my doctor.

You say why January:

- ** January symbolizes a fresh start, a blank canvas waiting to be painted with positive changes. Harness this energy to set realistic weight loss goals.
- **New Year Resolutions: The tradition of making resolutions aligns with the motivation to make positive changes. Harness the collective energy of people striving for same goals and use it as a support system.

You say how do I start:

Set Realistic Goals: Start with achievable, small goals.

- Balanced Diet: Focus on a balanced diet that includes a variety of nutrients.
 Incorporate lean proteins, whole grains, fruits, and vegetables while limiting processed foods and added sugars.
- Hydration: Drink plenty of water throughout the day. Sometimes, our bodies can confuse thirst with hunger, leading to unnecessary snacking.
- Regular Exercise: Find an exercise routine that you enjoy, whether it's walking, jogging, cycling, or dancing. Consistency is key, so aim for at least 150 minutes of moderate-intensity exercise per week.
- Track your steps. Our smart phones have a Pedometer that will track all steps during the day. I try for at least 5000 to 7000 steps a day.

When Your Plans Change:

When we think about planning our lives or talk to other Christians about making plans, there's one verse we've all heard. You know it well. "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps" (Proverbs 16:9). Let's be real for a moment. You've been told this or maybe even encouraged or corrected someone else with this verse. We know this verse, but do we really believe it? And if we believe it, do we really believe God is good in the way he establishes our steps?

It can be difficult, even devastating, sometimes for God to wreck your plans. You were certain you were where you were supposed to be. The problem is that deep down we think we know best. We know what we need to do and when we need to do it—or so we think. What's actually happening is a war in our hearts over who will rule our life: us or God. When our plans change, we must fight to believe that God rules and that he is the good and right ruler.

Here are 4 truths to remember when God changes your plans.

1. God is sovereign.

Sovereignty is the authority to rule. There are no limits to God's rule. Nothing is outside his control: not your life circumstances, your relationships, your family, or your job. Abraham Kuyper says, ""There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry: 'Mine!"[1] Everything belongs to him because he made everything. If he made everything, then he gets to decide how everything works. If he changes your plans, it's because he knows things you do not know. In the next two truths, we'll see why that's ultimately good.

Scripture to Memorize: "I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted." (Job 42:2)

2. God is good.

Knowing that God is in control, that he is sovereign, that he knows things we do not know is important. Maybe you realize this, but you have to also believe that what he says and does is good. When God created, he made everything good. If what he says and does is good, it's because he is good. We can trust him not only because he knows and made everything but because he is good. Imagine how beautiful that is, the person who knows everything is also good. C.S. Lewis wrote this about Aslan, "Who said anything about safe? 'Course he isn't safe. But he's good. He's the King, I tell you."[2] When he changes your plans, it's because he is good. Scripture to Memorize: "Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good! Blessed is the man who takes refuge in him!" (Psalm 34:8)

For Further Study: Read Genesis 1.

3. God is for your good.

Because God is good, everything he does is good. If everything he does is good, then everything he does is for your good. When he changes your plans, it's because he knows what you do not know and it's good for you. God loves you. He doesn't have ulterior motives or a hidden agenda. He is making us more and more like Jesus, his perfect Son. What could be better for you? Everything he does is preparing you for eternity with him. Everything he does is bringing glory to him, which is always good for you. It might not always feel good, but that doesn't mean it's not good. Your feelings are not truth. God's word is.

Scripture to Memorize: "And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called

according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28)

For Further Study: Read Philippians 1.

4. You are not God.

At the beginning, I told you about a war waging in your heart over who will rule your life: you or God. Here's what you need to know. You and I are not sovereign, no matter how much we want to be. We don't have ultimate knowledge or control. Apart from Jesus, we're good. We can't be good enough on our own. This leads us to not always pursue what's best for us. If our hearts apart from

Christ are turned towards evil and we don't know everything, we can't possibly always pursue what is good for us, even if we think it is. Simply, we need to trust God with our plans because he's God and we are not.

DOUBT IN THE MIDST OF TURMOIL - WAR GAMES

In this life, we face good times and times that are not so good. These are times that cause us to doubt God's love for us, our relationship with Him, and His willingness to act on our behalf. In these times, the enemy brings a wave of thoughts to penetrate our faith, for he knows without faith it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6). We not only need faith in the most troubled times, but it is the very thing we should walk in daily; acknowledging the One to whom honor is due for the blessings we're given. Faith in God's love and faith in His desire to move mountains for us is key. Many times, the mental shift in our lives comes when we believe the lies of the enemy to measure God's movement against our own "goodness" and abilities. When we try to compare the situation with our abilities instead of God's power, we fail to have faith in God.

Think about the 12 spies sent out to spy out the promised land. This land was already promised to them when Moses sent them to look; ten of them compared the giants in the land to themselves and said they are stronger and brought back an evil report of unbelief, fear, and doubt (Numbers 13:32). Two responded with faith that they were more than able. Why? Because they compared the challenge with their God and had complete faith in Him. As the story unfolds, we see that the fearful and distrusting report displeased God, and it didn't go well for them.

When the enemy tries to make us feel like we're in a crisis of faith, remember the great heroes of God's Word.

Let's look at John the Baptist, while imprisoned he sent two of his disciples to go ask Jesus, are You the One that should come, or do we look for another (Matthew II:3)? This is the same John that preached and said there is one that cometh whose shoes I am unworthy to bare. The one who said behold the Lamb of God when he saw Him (John I:29). The very one that saw the Heavens opened to Him, hearing the voice from Heaven saying, this is my beloved Son in Him I am well pleased, seeing the spirit of God descending on Him like a dove. Yet, in the midst of turmoil, he questioned.

Again, we look at the men of faith in Jesus's circle: the disciples. They were faced with a storm and cried out in fear, Lord, don't you care that we are going to die (Mark 4:38)!? He asked them why they were so fearful and wondered why they had no faith (Mark 4:40).

We must allow ourselves to realize we are human; God knows this more than anyone because He created us. In our lives, we have to be like David, who remembered past victories with the lion and the bear to en- courage himself; remember, God said that the battle is not ours it is His (2 Chronicles 20:15). Whether it's a dispute, a financial need, or maybe a health crisis, we must put it in His hands and refrain from worrying; worry is doubt; it's the effects of fear, so learning from others' experiences, let's not go there. Be careful to wash ourselves daily in the Word and allow the Word to fight our battles like Jesus did in the wilderness of temptation. If the enemy tempted Christ in the midst of His weakness, he will surely be the same coward and do it to us in the battlefield of the mind.

How can we apply this in our own lives? No matter what we face, we should pause a moment and align our minds with God's Word before we react. The Bible says to examine ourselves and see if we are in the faith (2 Corinthians 13:5). This is relevant to daily comparing our reactions to God's will and following His guidance through His Word.

- What past victories can you list and ponder as a reminder for the current battle?
- What scripture can you choose to stand on that is related to the battle you are facing? (Healing, strength, protection, provision, etc.)
- If you are not facing a battle, who in your life can you share your victory with to build their faith?

CMA vest standards

The CMA standard for vests states that:


- The front of a CMA member's vest is to include the CMA USA country patch on the upper left side of the vest (which places the stars closest to the heart and identifies the member's nation) and the 3" CMA logo or CMA name tag with logo on the upper right side of the vest. Nothing is to be placed above the country patch or the 3" CMA patch/name tag. Patches or pins that take you out of a neutral ministering position may not be worn on a vest with the CMA back patch or logo.


 The back of a CMA member's vest is to include
- The back of a CMA member's vest is to include the CMA back patch and be easily distinguishable that the person is a CMA member. No other patches or rockers should be placed on the back of a CMA vest (i.e. territorial rockers indicating a city, state, chapter, or other location).
